



What is cleft?

Cleft lip and palate, short for cleft lip and palate, is one of the most common birth defects in the world. Children with cleft lip and palate are born on all continents of the world. One in every 500 to 600 newborns worldwide is affected. The central treatment measure is surgery, ideally performed shortly after birth.

In most developing countries, many "cleft children" cannot undergo this surgical procedure, either because the parents are unaware of it or because of lack of money.

In many cases, the obvious "flaw" in



the child's face is accepted as punishment for their own misconduct. Apart from health problems such as proper breathing, swallowing and speaking - they are isolated, marginalised, stigmatised as disabled for life.

How does the organization work?

"Deutsche Cleft Kinderhilfe e.V." is a small non-profit association - present in Asia, South America and Africa. The organization helps cleft children to have access to safe, high-quality, and comprehensive treatment. In order to achieve this goal, it focuses on sustainable aid for cleft patients by establishing independent, permanent local treatment structures in its project countries.

Currently there are three projects centres in Vietnam, two in Hanoi and one in Ho Chi Minh City. They ensure a high level of medical care and offer access to follow-up therapies such as speech therapy or orthodontics.
